Article classification	During the submission process, please specify the broad theme (See above list) under which the paper should be categorised.
Headings	The preferred format is for first level headings to be in bold, and subsequent sub-headings to be in italics. Heading Font style- Times New Roman Size= 14/ Bold
Notes/endnotes	Notes or endnotes should only be used if absolutely necessary. They should be identified in the text by consecutive numbers enclosed in square brackets. These numbers should then be listed, and explained, at the end of the article.
References	All references in your manuscript must be formatted using one of the recognised APA styles. References to other publications in your text should be written as follows: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Single author: (Adams, 2006) • Two authors: (Adams & Brown, 2006) • Three or more authors: (Adams <i>et al.</i>, 2006) Please note, '<i>et al</i>' should always be written in italics.
